

Morrab/Hypatia Archive Collection

Following is a list of Archives held by The Morrab Library which form part of the Elizabeth Treffry Collection, donated to the library by the Hypatia Trust (<https://hypatia-trust.org.uk/>). Some larger archives are still held at Hypatia on a temporary basis until the refurbishment of the Morrab Library's Archive Room is completed. The collection is labelled *Morrab/Hypatia* and more detailed information on the collections can be provided on request.

These archives concern women who have a connection with Cornwall. Many are secondary sources but worthy of note because the originals are not kept in Cornwall. Where possible it is stated if it is known where the Primary Sources are located.

Alverton Women's Institute (1974-1985) History album of photographs - a record of West Penwith Festivals throughout the year.

Andrews, Marion (1839-1929) pseudonym Hare Christopher; Historian and author of both fiction and nonfiction, and well respected. All of her books are in the Elizabeth Treffry Room at the Morrab. There is a small, additional archive which is being kept at Hypatia for now.

Balmaidens : A manuscript of the book by Lyn Mayers. However she does retain the copyright.

Barns, Graham Wilhelmina: (1912-2004) CBE, one of the foremost abstract painters who lived in St Ives. This archive comprises secondary material for the most part. There are a couple of original letters about sales.

Bland, Lillian: (1878-1971), Built and flew planes, photographer and many other things.

Burston, Hazel (no dates), Director of Penlee House, historian. Documents are all secondary resources . Buried in Sennen Churchyard Cornwall.

Eme, Cherrill Edith Maud (1877-1947) Teacher, author and diarist (original diaries held at Hypatia until space allows at Morrab).

Cook, Judith (193?-2004): writer of historical novels, political journalist and political campaigner. Her books are in the Elizabeth Treffry Room.

Cornish Female Migration in the 19th century : secondary archive.

Cornish Suffrage: (early twentieth century) secondary material but includes 1913 march to Lands End to Hyde Park.

Crossley, Rachel (died 2004) - Original Artwork

Dennis, Thomasine: (1740-1799) writer born in Madron. Her novel is kept in the archive store.

Forbes, Elizabeth Stanhope (1859-1912) RA member, established Newlyn School. Most of the Morrab archive is secondary material. Original papers recently found are being kept at Hypatia until there is space for them at Morrab Library Archive.

Pout, Grace Pettman (1870-1951) Evangelist, writer lived in PZ. Author of many books and short stories. Original Large Archive. We hold 270 short stories and books written by her. The books are in the Elizabeth Treffry Room. Short stories are in the Archive.

Hilton, Rose: (1931-2019). Painter based in Cornwall from 1965. Secondary material.

Jesse, F. Tennyson (1888-1958) Criminologist and writer of both fiction and nonfiction all of her books are in the Elizabeth Treffry Room with a small archive in the basement.

Manuscripts: published and unpublished including two on Greenham Common. See separate list.

Richardson, Dorothy: small archive.

Royal Family: documents on the female line (twentieth century).

Sidgwick, Alfred Mrs.(1895 1934) author who lived in Lamorna, published forty books.

Sports : General notes on women in sport locally.

Suffrage and Suffragettes: (19th and 20th century) Cornish connection i.e. Emily Hobhouse. The march from Lands End to London in 1914. Mainly secondary archive.

Theatre Risotto: 1960s Variety of small pamphlets.

Thurston Violetta (1879-1978): original diaries - a large archive. WWI nurse and author, awarded five medals.

Ward, Humphry Mrs.(1851-1920) author, short biography.

Women' Land Army WWII (1939-2000s): Interviews with women who worked in the Land Army in Cornwall with photographs and other documents relating to the Women's Land Army.

Woolf, Virginia (1882-1941) Influential twentieth century writer. Small secondary archive and magazines. Her books are in the Elizabeth Treffry Room.
